



## **HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY STATEMENT**

It is the policy of Stone Computers to comply with the terms of the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 and subsequent legislation and to provide and maintain a healthy and safe working environment.

Stone Computers' health and safety objective is to minimise the number of instances of occupational accidents and illnesses to achieve an accident-free workplace.

It is the overall responsibility of the Board of Directors for the effectiveness of Health & Safety policy and the review of its performance.

The Senior Management Team shall be responsible for the implementation of H&S policies and reporting effectiveness to the Board.

All staff have a responsibility for their own safety and that of any other person who may be affected by their activities.

Staff shall be provided with such equipment, information, training and supervision as is necessary to implement the policy and achieve the stated objective.

Stone Computers recognise and accept their duty to protect the health & safety of all visitors to the company, including contractors and temporary workers, as well as any members of the public who might be affected by its activities.

Senior management will ensure the provision of effective systems for the reporting of injuries and illness; with subsequent reporting to regulatory bodies as required. Equally provision shall be made for the representation of staff and consultation with them, on Health & Safety matters.

The Senior management team shall maintain a policy manual detailing how it will meet relevant H&S legislation, guidance or best practise and ensure that all relevant information is made available to its staff or other stakeholders.
